Phase II Project Details:

The beautiful conceptual picture of Bharatiya Temple (seen in the previous page) with Phase II Indianization effect has been designed and developed in consultation with Padmasri Muthia Stapathi from Chennai, India. The Temple building will have a beautiful Rajgopuram at the main entrance, one large Shikhar for Sri Laxmi Narayan, Sri Radha Krishna and Sri Ram Parivar and six separate Shikhars for Sri Venkateswara, Sri Mahavirswami, Ma Durga, Sri Siva Parvati, Sri Ganesha and Sri Hanuman. Phase II will also include Indianization of all windows, doors and all outside wall covering. All inside temple altars will be decorated with Indian carvings and designs. Full size black granite Vighras and white marble Moorties will be coming from Mahabalipuram, Chennai and Jaipur, Rajasthan.

We are planning to start Phase II construction by spring 2007 and celebrate Pran Pratistha Mahotsava by summer of 2008. Total cost of Phase II project is estimated to be about \$750,000. Directions to Bharatiya Temple and Cultural Center

From the West:

1. Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike traveling East
Get off at Exit # 339 (Ft. Washington).
1. After tolls merge on to 309 North (towards Ambler)
2. Travel about 8 miles on 309 and make a right on to Stump Road
3. After about 2.4 miles right on to County Line Road
4. Temple is on your right.

From North Jersey:

1. Travel on NJ Turnpike and take exit # 6 to Pennsylvania Turnpike
2. Travel West on PA Turnpike (276 W).
3. Get off at Exit # 339 (Ft. Washington).
4. After tolls merge on to 309 North (towards Ambler)
5. Travel about 8 miles on 309 and make a right on to Stump Road
6. After about 2.4 miles right on to County Line Road
7. Temple is on your right.

From Philadelphia, South Jersey:

1. Take 76 West (Schuylkill Expressway) towards Valley Forge
2. After about 11 miles, take exit for 476 North towards Plymouth Meeting.
3. Travel about 4 miles and merge on to 276 East/Pennsylvania Turnpike towards New Jersey.
4. Travel for about 4 miles and get off at Exit # 339 (Ft. Washington).
5. After tolls, merge on to 309 North (towards Ambler)
6. Travel about 8 miles on 309 and make a right on to Stump Road
7. After about 2.4 miles right on to County Line Road
8. Temple is on your right.
